**Creative Quiltworks Committee: Kristin Callahan & Ellen Moore**

The project for February is an EPP (English Paper Piecing) Dragonfly by Kristin. This motif uses honeycomb shapes, a hexagon, and a long pointy triangle. Once you make the dragonfly, you can applique it onto anything! The directions and templates for the dragonfly are on the newsletter page of the website; they are being mailed to those members without internet access.



Kristin made this dragonfly. She offers the following helpful hints:  
*"I didn't have card stock so I glued the printed paper to index card pieces!*  
*Cut fabric 1/4 to 3/8 inch larger than paper!*  
*Glue or baste down hem!*  
*Sew wings to head and to each other!*  
*Sew tail to head!*  
*Appliqué to anything!*  
*Bling with crystals or fabric markers!"*

Send in a photo of your dragonfly! It'll be fun to see what creative uses you all come up with this motif.

A sympathy card was sent to Rebecca Mohammadi on the death of her husband from complications due to COVID-19.


### Member Photos


**Member News & Miscellaneous: Dottie Macomber**

**A challenge!** To follow up on Martha's challenge in January to look into our stashes for our next project, I am issuing a challenge to you all to do just that! All you have to do is pick out 12 fat quarters' worth of fabric (or 12 pieces of fabric at least 14" square) to make an **Ugly Quilt!** These fabrics can be ones you've had for a while and now your tastes are different; they can be ones you got in our Fat Quarter drawing that just don't go with anything else you have; or they can be WWITs (What Was I Thinking?!?). Karen Brown of Just Get It Done Quilts has a tutorial for using these fabrics to make what she calls The Ugly Quilt, a quilt that you can use for utilitarian purposes (keep in the car, take to put on the ground if you go on a picnic, etc.) Or you can use more coordinated fabrics if you don't like the hodge-podge look. However, it is interesting how the resulting quilt doesn't look quite as ugly as some of the individual fabrics in her example! I'm going to try one of these this year; I've already picked out some ugly fabrics from my stash. How will it turn out? Who knows, but the process looks like fun.

I have also posted a pdf of the written instructions on our website under the Newsletter tab, and I've included them with this newsletter for those of you without internet access.

Karen's basic directions are for a quilt that finishes at 36" x 45", a lap- or child-sized quilt, but you can also make the quilt larger by using more fabrics and making additional blocks.



What do you say? Ready for the Ugly Quilt Challenge? Be sure to send me a photo of your Ugly Quilt and I'll send you an "Award" Certificate "suitable for framing", as they say!
