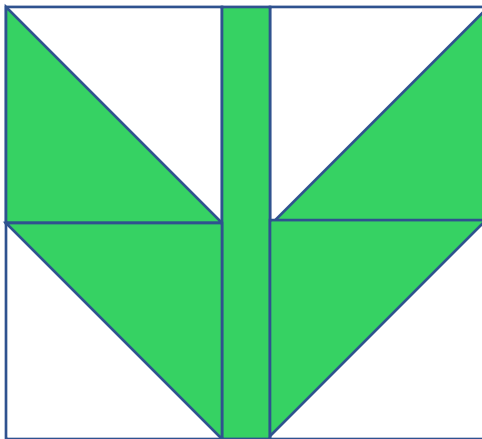
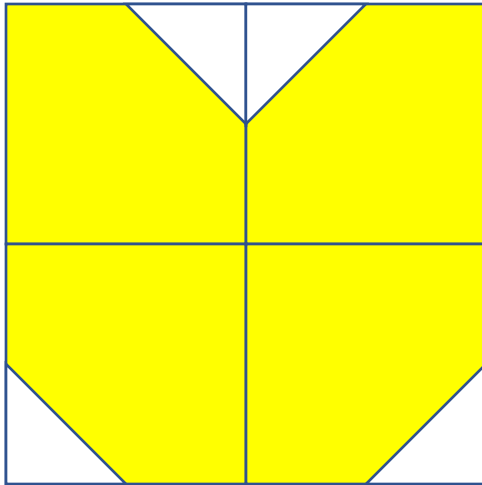


May 2021 Block of the Month: Tulip



Cutting:

Four 5" squares of a pastel color fabric/fabrics (don't have to be the same fabric)

Four 2 ½" squares white-on-white background fabric

Two 5" squares of green fabric

Two 5" squares of white-on-white background fabric

One 8 ½" x 1 ½" green strip for stem

Sewing instructions"

Using the 2 ½" background squares, "snowball" one corner of each pastel square. Sew these four units together to make the flower block.

Place green and white 5" squares RST (right sides together). Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the white square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away on both sides of the line. Cut apart on drawn line; repeat with other two squares. This makes four HST (half square triangle) units measuring $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew in pairs (see diagram for correct orientation) to make the right and left leaf units. Sew stem between the two leaf units to make the leaf block.

Sew the flower block to the leaf block. Finished block will measure $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $17\frac{1}{2}$ ".
