Thank you to Ruth Ashton for two donations to the ruler library: #1038, 60 degree diamond making 1" to 4" finished diamonds; and #1039, Perfect Piecer by Jinny Beyer for joining four, six, or either points with accuracy. Let's highlight #1039, the Perfect Piecer. This ruler is for those who sew by hand or machine. According to the Jinny Beyer website, "It's ideal for marking seam allowances and seam intersections so your patchwork fits together beautifully." And "The tiara-shaped acrylic template includes all the common angles used in traditional quilt making: 90°, 60°, 45°, 30°, 22.5°, 135° and 120°."

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
