She has devised patterns for the anvil design we use and has cross stitch directions so people can use them as a possible way to add their names to the name tags.

If you want to make a name tag, please bring two 8-inch fabric squares, one dark for the background and one light for the anvil on which to sew or print your name for the top of the name tag and one 8-inch fabric square for the backing and some batting. We really hope you will try to make a name tag so we can get to know everyone who comes to guild! Ruth is a great teacher, and they are small, so they won't take too long.

#### **Charity Donations Committee: Gretchen Berkowitch & Louise Nazzaro**

The current donation quilt count is:

86 Quilts (baby to lap) 90 Pillowcases (everyday juvenile pillowcases) 76 Snowmen Pillowcases

There were six Oh My Stars quilts made over the summer and donated at the September meeting.

All of the quilts we collected in September were great and I hope everyone got to see them on display at the meeting.

We are short of our goal of reaching between 90 and 100 quilts and snowmen pillowcases. We will be collecting quilts and pillowcases at the October and November meetings. At this point, we are looking for lap size quilts for older kids.

For newer members, charity work is part of the Guild's mission. As a member of the Guild, we ask that each member make a pillowcase and children's quilt. During the holidays, we stuff the snowmen pillowcases with a quilt made by the membership and then the Guild purchases games, books, toys, hygiene products, hats and gloves for children and teens to add as well. Pillowcases are donated to the Department of Children and Families and to the Home for Little Wanderers, North Shore Division. In November we will be asking for volunteers to help stuff the pillowcases. Details to follow.

At the December meeting we will be collecting food for the Saugus Food Pantry. THIS INCLUDES baby food, formula, and non-perishable food items.

We will also be collecting RWB (Red/White/Blue) pillowcases and RWB (Red/White/Blue) blocks that finish at 12×12 inches. For new quilters this means the blocks you donate should measure 12.5x12.5 inches.

For reference, here are approximate measurements for donation quilts: Baby Quilt: 30" x 40" Crib: 36" x 52" Throw (lap): 55" x 65"
