EXCITING MULTI-GUILD PROJECT FROM MARATHON QUILTERS

Marathon Quilters Guild—The Marathon Quilt Guild, located in Hopkinton, MA, is pleased to announce an open invitation to quilt guilds, community groups, quilters and fiber artists to participate in an invitational quilt exhibit to be debuted at its April 11 - 12, 2026 quilt show. The show will be held at the Hopkinton Center for the Arts, 98 Hayden Rowe Street, Hopkinton, MA 01748. The exhibit will be an 8 panel "polyptych" quilt, with each representing one of the eight towns along the Marathon route. The exhibit will be submitted to the New England Quilt

Museum for display consideration. Future travel and submission plans for the final project will be made to include participating towns, quilt guilds, regional and national shows and exhibitions. Panels will not be returned to the group or individual who created it.

The Marathon Quilt Guild will create the first panel, representing Hopkinton. There will be one panel per town, for a total of 8 panels. Each panel will align with the panel(s) next to it with a continuous line representing the race route. All panels will be 60" tall and 24" wide, and be finished with a faced edge, no binding. All other panel design elements are left to the creativity of the group or individual designing each panel, and a planning meeting with all groups will be planned to discuss and agree to all design parameters.

Wayside Quilters Guild—

In November, Joanne introduced the Scrappy Rectangle or Potato Chip Block. It's called potato chip block because nobody can make just one.

For the December meeting please engage in an informal rectangle swap by bringing rectangles to the December meeting. The rectangles can be 2" x 3.5" or 2.5" x 4.5"

Our December meeting will be a sweet or savory finger food potluck social. Each person will get a playing card when they come and all the clubs will sit at one table, all the hearts at another and so on. Members are asked to bring a used book (quilt or fiction) to swap, wrapped in a fat quarter, and include a homemade

bookmark. We will play a dice game to swap gifts. Each person, in turn, rolls the dice and that group follows the chart. Once everyone has had a chance to roll, people open the gift they are holding.

Chart for dice game

- 1 keep your gift
- 2 steal someone's gift
- 3 everyone pass the gift to the left
- 4 everyone pass the gift to the right
- 5 keep your gift
- 6 steal anyone's gift.

After opening the gift – everyone gets another turn to roll the die.

We will also play Quilt Block Puzzles. Each team then gets a bag of paper shapes. The team tries to put together as many "quilt" blocks as they can. 4 points for each block made, and bonus 4 points for using all the pieces.
