
Donation Committee:

Quilt Show News: Nov 4th and 5th, 2023 (Set up Nov 3rd)

Quilt show Committee: Meetings are held the 2nd Saturday of each month.

We would like to introduce the 2023 Quilt Show Committee:



- Members wanting to hang a quilt in the show must volunteer to either help with set up, take down or work a 2-hour shift at the show. Please see Linda Repucci or Judy Massakowski. They will be circulating a volunteer sheet starting at the <u>April</u> Meeting.
- ➤ If you did not receive your raffle quilt tickets at the last meeting, please see John Balliro. It is the responsibility of each member to sell tickets. We are asking each member to sell 4 books of 6-tickets (\$5/book). If you do not sell all four books, please return unsold books. Deadline to return sold tickets will be the <u>September meeting</u>.
- ➤ If you are interested in selling boutique items, 20% of the proceeds will go to the guild. Members who are interested in selling a quilt they hang in the show will be sold through the boutique, and 20% of the proceeds will go to the guild. Details about the boutique will be discussed at the April Meeting
- ➤ Registration forms will be distributed at the April meeting. Deadline for returning the forms is the June meeting. Judges will be the quilt show committee. Only members will be judged for machine quilting categories.

- Traditionally tables donate a basket for the Penny Sale. Several tables can collaborate and donate one basket. Joyce will be talking with members about the details at the April Meeting. Joyce will have a list to avoid duplication. Theme ideas in years past: Wine Basket, Italian Basket, Movie Night Basket. A knitting Basket and Sewing Basket are both being assembled for the 2023 show.
- ➤ We need volunteers for demonstrations. If you have a technique or an interesting quilting topic you would like to share, we would love to have your expertise. Demonstrations are 20-30 minutes. If anyone is interested in doing a demonstration, please see Sally or Gretchen.
